


Leash Up for Safety: Why Keeping Your Dog on a Leash Matters

In our friendly Baton Rouge neighborhood, dogs are more than pets—they're family. We love seeing them out and about, enjoying the fresh air and getting exercise. However, as responsible pet owners, it's essential that we always keep our dogs on a leash when they are outside the safety of our own yards.

Letting your dog roam freely, even just down the street, might seem harmless, but it can pose serious risks—to your dog, to other people, and to the community at large.



1. Encounters with Other Dogs:

Not all dogs are friendly or well-socialized. An unleashed dog may approach another leashed dog, potentially triggering fear or aggression. What begins as curiosity can quickly turn into a dangerous confrontation, resulting in injury to either dog or their humans trying to break it up.

2. Interactions with Small Children:

Children often don't understand how to approach animals safely, and dogs can react unpredictably when startled. An unleashed dog running up to a child, even in play, can lead to scratches, bites, or lasting fear of dogs. Leashing your pet helps prevent unintentional accidents.

3. Risk of Traffic Accidents:

Even well-trained dogs can dart into the street if they spot a squirrel, cat, or another dog. This sudden movement can lead to tragic accidents. A leash is a simple, effective barrier between your dog and oncoming vehicles.

4. Legal Responsibility:

Baton Rouge has leash laws in place for a reason. Owners of off-leash dogs can be held legally and financially responsible for any injuries or damages caused by their pet. Avoid the stress—and potential fines—by keeping your dog leashed.




